- Explorer Camp (3 days/2 nights) just for kids entering grade 3







Katrina taught us so much. We will always remember her acceptance of life's changes and the happiness she exuded wherever she was and in whatever circumstance. If we commented on her centennial stance she would say, "But I feel like fifty!", and always "I feel so goot," or "I like it here."

What a grand Christmas Katrina must have had with her beloved Oluf, her daughter Lila, her daughterin-law Susan and with old friends like Josie and Oscar Bergren and so many others.
