Communion Bread

(makes six 6-inch rounds)

from Luther Seminary (adapted by Doug Peterson for Trinity, Enumclaw)

Prayer

As the grains of wheat, once scattered on the ground,

Are gathered into one to become our bread,

So may all your people, from all the ends of earth,

Be gathered into one in you. (Marty Haugen, Now the Feast & Celebration)

Please bless our hands in the making, Others' hands in the breaking. Amen.

3 ½ cups wheat flour blend dry ingredients together

2 cup white flour

2 teaspoon baking powder

2 teaspoon salt

4 tablespoons oil cut in oil

1 ½ cups very hot water combine water and sweeteners

1/3 cup honey

1/3 cup molasses Add to dry ingredients.

Mix and knead only until dough is blended.

Divide into six equal balls. Roll each into a ½ inch thick circle about six inches across. Score each circle lightly (1/8 inch deep) with a knife in pie-slice shaped pieces. Bake at **350 degrees** for **18-20 minutes** until light brown on the bottom. Do not overcook. Cool. Store in freezer bags. (This recipe is also great for camping and hiking.) Enjoy!

A horse won three races in a row to become in almost 150 years the 12th horse to win all three and he didn't have blinders on! Blinders! What are they and why? Blinders keep a horse from seeing what is beside and behind him in order to that he does not become afraid or threatened by what is around him and is able to do his job. We might call this tunnel vision. In the 95 Theses, Luther questions some of the "tunnel" vision that concerns him.

Highlight Summary of 2015 Montana Synod Assembly, Great Falls, June 5-7

Voting members from Faith: Celeste Pogachar, Pastor Brenda, John Trangmoe ASSEMBLY THEME: Serve the World, Especially the Poor and Those in Need

Actions carrying out the theme: (1) Delegates provided non-perishable food as an offering to a large food bank in Great Falls known as FISH. This project in 2014 distributed over 50 tons of food. Involved are 13 churches (five Lutheran) and a service club. (2) Montana Synod is now a partner with Intermountain Children's Home in Helena and the Flathead. They provide on a daily basis services to hundreds of children due to trauma, neglect, abuse and other related situations. (3) On the global scene our synod is planning *Water Project in Bolivia*. The outcome is to assist this South American country with pumps and pipelines to bring water to the higher grazing land for the livestock. Increasing the number of cattle will mean more milk and meat for the needs of the people. Faith provided a donation to this fund drive.

Music for the assembly: A group of talented musicians from throughout the world provided a wide variety of music vocally and on instruments. Asian, Italian, Spanish and English selections were presented throughout the three days. For most of the performers it was their first visit to Montana.

Voting: 331 eligible voting members from throughout Montana and Northern Wyoming voted in approval of various actions including:

Resolutions for affirmed membership of the synod in the Montana Association of Christians and the recognizing and approval of a new ELCA congregation - New Hope Lutheran in Great Falls.

Elections: Harold Spilde had faithfully served as synod treasurer for 22 years. His announced retirement resulted in *Sue Ost*, Havre, being approved for the position. Eleven clergy and lay members were voted as delegates to the 2016 churchwide convention. Included is *Ben Peterson* of our congregation. *John Trangmoe* will be a member of the Discipline Committee.

Budget: The 2016 version in the amount of \$1,080,500 was approved. With the exception of \$30,000 in other expected revenue, the total is supported by contributions from congregations. Faith's church council has submitted an estimated amount of \$15,000. Disbursements will include support for three non-revenue congregations of Freedom in Christ Prison (Deer Lodge), Rocky Boy and Spirit of Life (Fort Peck). Limited funds will go to Concordia and Pacific Lutheran University, which are often attended by young people of our congregation.

Recognition: It is 55 years since the ordination of **Pastor Bud Holmlund.** He retired in 1995 after pastoring in South Dakota. After moving to Hamilton he became a member of Faith and currently resides at the Bee Hive Homes.

Synod House: Fund drive continues for the building of new synod headquarters in Great Falls. Faith delegates presented financial support from our Scandivian Dinner receipts.

Reforming Christian Education: A survey of young adults (ages 20 to 35) learned that 1/3 of these folks reported no church affliation. Others that claim a church are often not satisfied with sermons and doctrine. This provides the challenge not only for ELCA, the Montana Synod and our own congregation which is each and every one of us to discuss the topic of change.

Cheap Grace and Priceless Community

On April 9, 1945, Dietrich Bonhoeffer was put to death by the Nazis. Like Anne Frank and many other nameless victims, he came heartbreakingly close to surviving the war. Like Oscar Romero, a Salvadoran bishop who was assassinated in 1980, he fought against a corrupt government and paid with his life. Bonhoeffer was one of the most influential theologians of the 20th century. A Lutheran pastor, he lived what he preached, actively resisting the Nazis and living in intentional community. He was arrested for his role in an attempt on Adolf Hitler's life. He was killed for his integrity.

How the world has changed since his death.

Over the past 50 or so years of the 20th century, many people came to see Christianity as just one more way to self-enlightenment or self-improvement. Many people combined Christian and Eastern practices, and most of them showed they had precious little knowledge of either. Or worse, people viewed Christianity as a path to riches. The best-seller lists are full of books that promise a Christian way to self-fulfillment or riches, while books of sturdy theology will never be known by most readers.

Bonhoeffer is one of a multitude of theologians who warns us against this kind of thinking. He calls it cheap grace, this salvation that doesn't require us to change our comfortable lives—or worse, tells us to expect more comfort. He said, "Cheap grace is the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline, communion without confession, absolution without personal confession. Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ, living and incarnate. Costly grace is the gospel which must be sought again and again, the gift which must be asked for, the door at which a person must knock" (*The Cost of Discipleship*).

My younger self loved this stern Bonhoeffer. My older self wonders if we might have seized on the wrong Bonhoeffer text. I've been rereading *Life Together*, his classic text of how Christians can live in various types of intentional community. Many of us never move beyond thinking about the costs of discipleship. This book shows us how best to bear these costs.

In *Life Together*, Bonhoeffer wrote: "Christian brotherhood is not an ideal which we must realize; it is rather a reality created by God in Christ in which we may participate." In this time when so many of us spend so much energy discussing the best ways to be a church, and to be the church, it's a relief to read these words. The community already exists. We don't have to create it, but we do need to choose to participate in it.

Bonhoeffer went on to discuss various ministries that will help strengthen that community, as well as practices that will help believers when they are solitary. For those of us rooted in the church, these ideas will feel like old friends.

For those yet to find a Christian community, these ideas may be more attractive than the ones encountered in *The Cost of Discipleship*, and perhaps for the rest of us too. Many of us live in a world where grace doesn't come easily. The idea of gaining strength through community seems more relevant than ever. The idea of strengthening our Christian communities so we radiate God's love more brightly is as important today as when Bonhoeffer explored these ideas. (submitted by Scott Southwick)
