Lutheran. With old Martin Luther we place our trust in the God who loves us first, not in our own responses or actions. We cherish and study the Bible, relying on the Spirit of God to reveal our sin, draw us to the living Christ, and transform our lives.

Family of God. Like a human family, God's children are bound by blood—the blood of Jesus, who pursues each and every person to death and back with an unquenchable, inescapable love. As we live with God and others—loving, enjoying, serving, wounding, offending, forgiving, reconciling—God makes us more and more like Jesus. As a family, our responsibility is to raise and send mature citizens to love and serve the world (Dt. 6:4-9). Adults love and teach kids; all love and care for the sick, the stranger, the poor, the aging, "the least of these" among us.

Built on love. "We love, because God first loved us." (1 John 4:19) God's *hesed/agape* love *always* places others first and gives itself to serve the neighbor, and even the enemy (Romans 5:8). God's love, poured into our hearts through Jesus' story and his living Spirit, compels us to serve neighbors and even enemies.

Worshiping... is a taste of Heaven, a glimpse of the beauty, joy, truth, community, and adventure of eternity. We gather weekly for Sabbath, as have God's people for millennia, to sing, pray, wrestle with God and others, and share a meal of forgiveness and freedom. We lean on ancient prayers and creeds and freely enjoy new styles and expressions of prayer and praise.

Welcoming. Jesus welcomed all people with no distinction. He taught, healed, ate, prayed, and wept with his friends—and so do we. Whether you come once or for a lifetime, you are fully welcome here, part of the family. You belong, just as you are. Members of Faith are the first in every situation to welcome strangers in love.

Serving. God provides all we need. Made in God's image, we provide for others near and far. From cups of coffee to quilts flown 'round the world to the Habitat House down the street, Faith's members and friends answer the call to serve the oppressed, the widow, and the orphan (Isa.1:17), the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind (Lk. 14:13), people just like us.





Published the week of March 2 in the Bitterroot Star and Missoulian...

Dear Neighbors,

As the people of the Bitterroot Valley debate who should and who should not be allowed to live here, we have heard much fear, anger, and distrust. As pastors, Christians, and members of this community, we feel called to speak a different word.

Though the Bible is full of stories of violence and war, sometimes by God's command, its movement is toward the unity of peoples and love for our neighbors—even our enemies. God promised Abraham that through him "all the peoples on earth will be blessed" (Genesis 12). After freeing the children of Israel from slavery in Egypt, God taught them through Moses, "When a foreigner resides among you in your land, do not mistreat them. The foreigner residing among you must be treated as your native-born. Love them as yourself, for you were foreigners in Egypt" (Leviticus 19).

In Jesus, God's heart for peace is fully displayed (John 1). In days of brutal Roman violence toward his own people, Jesus said, "You have heard it was said, 'Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." In fact, Jesus died at the hands of his enemies, praying from the cross: "Father, forgive them; they don't know what they're doing" (Luke 23). Christ calls those who would follow him to pick up our own crosses and offer the same life-giving love to all others (Luke 9).


It is good and right that our government—national and local—protect our people and our borders. At the same time, it is God's call through the centuries, taught and lived in Jesus, that God's people extend our hands in welcome and reconciliation (2 Corinthians 5), even if it costs our own lives.

A life full of anger and fear is not living, is it? Walls and guns won't keep us safe. Neighbors watching out for one another, communities that speak and act for the benefit of those most in need—these are the ways that make for peace.

So, dear neighbors of many religious traditions or none at all, a challenge: let's make Ravalli County a safer, better place—one word of welcome, one act of kindness, one prayer, one neighbor at a time.



Helen Volden: Convener/President.




African Children's Choir Comes to Hamilton! 7:00pm, May 11, 2016 Hamilton Performing Arts Center
