Fabulous, Flawed, Forgiven & Filled

With the opportunity to consider Spiritual Gifts with women in retreat and our Confirmands on May 1 (Happy May Day!), I'm thinking big picture:

Friends of Faith, our tradition teaches you are FABULOUS! Genesis 1 says over and over that God created all things good, *tov* (say tove), and that all things together in the end are *tov tov*—VERY good. In Ephesians 1, Paul claims each of us is God's *poiema*, God's masterpiece or work of art, poetry in motion, I like to say. Some have believed the Christian tradition thinks poorly of humanity, critters, and our beautiful, fragile planet—but it doesn't. As singer David Crowder writes, "You make everything glorious, and I am yours. What does that make me?" Well...? Glorious. Fabulous. Really.

Of course, fabulous isn't the whole story. It's pretty clear that humans in general, probably you, and most certainly me are also FLAWED. There's my bum knee, reminding me my body's mortal and breaks more easily (and mysteriously) than I wish. And there's my amazing ability to blame others instead of taking responsibility, to get snippy when I'm tired or somebody crosses me, and to take the most wonderful situation and find problems with it. And those are just the sins I commit before 8 or 9 am! Consider Syria, the presidential election, healthcare, the front page of the Ravalli Republic or your own family for further evidence: We're flawed. All of us.

Fabulous. Flawed. And FORGIVEN. Some folks these days don't believe in God. But I do. I believe in a God whose Spirit was fully embodied in a man named Jesus who lived the life God intends for each of us (trusting, loving, healing, risking, standing for what he believed), who died rather than play it small, and who rose, still loving, still forgiving, still inviting you and me to come near to God and follow his Way. You are forgiven. You can start new.

Because you are FILLED. Lutherans claim it happens in Baptism, whether we feel it or not: we are filled with the Holy Spirit of God (1 Cor 12). Sometimes I imagine the Spirit of God is like the spirit of a great coach—my coach's confidence, enthusiasm, positivity, hard work, and discipline fill the members of my team...and create a "team spirit" that has a life of its own. In the same way, the Spirit of God through Jesus fills and inspires us, starting as a small flame that grows as we draw nearer to our coach and teammates, as we practice and drill in worship and service and prayer. Whenever we read the Bible and speak love and truth to one another, the Spirit's flame warms us and others with "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." (Gal. 5) If you want God's Spirit within you to grow, find some ways to give it fuel, then watch out! And when you notice a friend's or teammate's flame dim and flicker, offer some of the Spirit's warmth. You'll both glow a bit brighter.

Because your friends—and you—are fabulous. And flawed. Forgiven. And filled. Whether you feel it or not. Burn on, Friends of Faith!



March Council Highlights

There is a spring work day scheduled for April 23 at 9am until noon. Your assistance would be greatly appreciated. Also with regards to keeping up with maintenance of the church, It was brought to the attention of Council of the need to paint the exterior of the church. Presently there is not enough in the building maintenance fund to cover this expense.

Several items are proceeding to help raise funds for the church; 50-mile garage sale, a 10% fee from fund raisers used to help support the church, and planning of another silent auction later in the year.

Staff received a very modest but long overdue increase to their wages of 2%. The increase amounted to less than \$500 for the remainder of the year. The wage increases will be funded by reducing from items within the existing budget. ~ *Mark Grotbo*, *Steward of Communications*

May 2016 Finance Report

I am pleased to report to the congregation that Quarter 1 (January thru March) expenditures are within our budget. Contributions are also well ahead of expenditures compared to last year. I would like to thank Council for their diligence and the entire congregation for their generous giving during this period.

Council has also approved several initiatives to grow our General Fund Reserve Fund (rainy day fund) to three times monthly operating expenses (the reserve fund will currently cover only one month of operating expenses). A three month reserve is the minimum recommended for all businesses and private individuals. Getting to a three month reserve will be a multi-year effort, but Council has charted the course to get there and we are on our way!

Here are the highlights of what we are doing and where we are in the process:

Quarter 1 Budget Report:

- 1. Quarter 1 Budget. Council held expenditures to slightly under the budget for Quarter 1. Council will continue to monitor budget very closely as we proceed through the year and I will report status to the congregation again at the end of Quarter 2.
- 2. Quarter 1 Income/Expense. Income for Quarter 1 exceeded expenditures by approximately \$4,400. This compares to a \$6,000 deficit for the same period last year. It is very important to build up a surplus at this time of year as many anticipated expenses fall later on. Thanks again to the congregation for your generous support during Quarter 1!

Council Approved Initiatives To Grow The General Fund Reserve Fund:

- 1. 50 Mile Garage Sale Fundraiser! FLC will participate in the Second Annual Bitterroot 50 Mile Garage Sale. FLC will join the garage sale on Saturday, June 25th. We will conduct the sale in our parking lot and we hope to accompany it with a bake sale and opportunities for outreach with tours of the Church and general information. I will have more on this as we move closer to the event but keep this in mind for now!!
- 2. 10% Overhead Fee To Be Added To Church Supported Fundraisers. Our congregation works hard to support many activities with fundraisers throughout the year. A small amount of fundraiser profits need to go back to the Church to help cover overhead and improve its financial position. All overhead fees will be directed into the General Fund Reserve Fund.
- 3. Dinner with Silent/Live Auction Fundraiser. This fundraiser was approved for a yet to be determined date later this year. All profits will go into the General Fund Reserve Fund.

Please let me know if you have any suggestions, questions or concerns.

Bishop Jessica Crist

Brita Stendahl, in her book: Sabbatical Reflections: The Ten Commandments in a New Day, describes how a sabbatical influenced her understanding of Sabbath:

"For us the greatest and loveliest result of the sabbatical year was that it gave us our lives back. In small measure that is what the Sunday service is supposed to do every week. It gives us back the week for judgment and forgiveness. The purpose of worship is not to hear a sermon, to sing a hymn or two. It is something much larger: to come in contact with the world as it is and as we want it to be. Both, and at the same time. That's why it looks so silly to an outsider and observer who objects to the seemingly easy transition, not knowing that it is not easy at all. It is an ongoing process, Sunday after Sunday. It is not habit; it is discipline and discipleship. In one short hour to moan and to mourn and then to forget oneself and join with joy the others in a mock-up banquet reminding us of bread-hunger, wine-blood, life-death, and resurrection-the hope that defies despair. You don't do that in an hour—the hour becomes only a manifestation of what it takes a lifetime to realize."

Sabbath is a precious gift in our overprogrammed and over secularized society. Remember.

Words From the Bishop..... Deepen faith and witness - Gratitude

"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (I Thessalonians 5: 16-18)

Gratitude is a faith practice. Sometimes we think gratitude is simply saying "Thank you." My parents taught us to say "please" and "thank you." And we taught our children to say "please" and "thank you." Good manners are the foundation of a civil society, and we could all use a refresher course, especially in this political climate. Good manners are not the cure to all of society's ills-but they are a start.

Good manners involve reciprocity. You do something for someone else, and they do it for you. The "Golden Rule," which has parallels in almost every religious tradition, says, "Do to others as you would have them do to you." (Luke 6:31) Just about everybody agrees that it is a common-sense moral guide, as universally applicable as "Do no harm." But Jesus, immediately after pronouncing "Do unto others as you would have them do to you," in Luke's Gospel, immediately goes way beyond it. "If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love them." (v. 32).

Jesus goes beyond reciprocity and good manners, into deep commitment. And that is what gratitude is. It is far more than an automatic "thank you." Gratitude is a whole way of life that is learned. Gratitude is knowing that everything that we have and that everything we are comes from God. Gratitude is finding grace and the hand of God in everything we experience. Gratitude is what enabled Martin Rinkhart to write "Now Thank We All Our God," in the midst of an epidemic that took his wife and children. Gratitude is what made it possible for South Africans under the yoke of Apartheid to sing, "We are Marching in the Light."

Gratitude is not rosy optimism or shallow happiness. Gratitude embraces pain and sorrow, and sees God's love through it all. How many times have you heard someone say, "I would never have wanted this, but I have been so changed and so blessed throughout it." That is gratitude, born out of grief, born out of experience.

Gratitude is a response to love, to grace, to life. It is a way of life. It is thankfulness, generosity, trust and joy. There are no "buts" with gratitude. Gratitude is complete. In Paul's first letter to the Corinthians he writes: "I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus." (I Corinthians 1: 4-5) His gratitude does not prevent him from admonishing them harshly immediately thereafter.

Gratitude is not a behavior. It is an orientation, an approach to life. It doesn't dull the senses or cloud the judgment. Rather it is an interpretive lens through which we view and experience all of life. It is extravagant, and it is counter-cultural. There is nothing rational about gratitude. In the end, it is a gift.

Henri Nouwen decided to leave his comfortable academic appointment and live among the poorest of the poor in Latin America. He went to help because he had so much to offer and they were in so much need. Instead he learned that these people whom he imagined had nothing were always giving to others, always grateful to others. Whatever they had they shared, and gratefully. He called his book Gracias!, because that's what he heard everywhere he went. "Gracias!" Not desperate, not pleading, but confident, joyous. Gratitude. It is a faith practice. ~Jessica Crist, Bishop

We simply ask that you fill out a **matching campership form** (attached, or found on the counter outside of the church office) and return it to Celeste before you leave for camp. She will then notify the camp that Faith Lutheran Church will cover half of the cost of registration (up to \$200), or more in needed (let us know). Other discounts are available too. Check the brochure, or the website. If you have been to camp before, bring a friend who has never been to camp and receive \$200 off your registration!
- **3. Your whole family can go to camp!** Go for a week (July 3-8) or just a weekend (July 22-24), Labor Day Family Camp (Sept. 2-5). Or participate in the **Thrivent Memorial Day Work weekend for FREE!** Light work, includes sprucing up camp for summer visitors. Unless you're good with power tools....! Plenty of time for fun stuff too. A great introduction to camp life for those kids who may be a bit hesitant.
- **4. Weeklong camp** onsite is for those kids entering 3rd grade through 9th grade. However, those kids entering 3rd grade may also go for a **partial week** (June 19-21, 22-24, or July 24-26, 27-29) **High school kids often go offsite** on adventure camps, such as sailing, rock climbing, rafting, biking, servant trips...... but may stay onsite as well.
- **5. Check out the camp brochure at** <u>www.flbc.net</u>. There are many specialty camps for all ages (even grandparents with grandchildren): cooking, basketball, horseback riding, night camp, MAD (music, art, drama) and more. Also, there are a few brochures on the counter outside of the church office. And lastly, if you are not able to get up to the camp this summer, be sure to get a mini "camp fix" at **Faith's VBS, July 11-15.** A tremendous outreach for our community. Even big kids can participate as helpers! We are committed to helping as many kids as possible experience Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp's amazing outdoor ministry! Let us know how we can assist you in making that happen for your family!
