

We hope you all have had a restful and blessed summer. However, our hearts and prayers go out to all those evacuated and to those that lost their homes in the Roaring Lion fire. And to our local fire fighters, RC Sheriff's Department - you are beyond amazing, so appreciated and we are all so grateful for ALL you do!

Many of you have heard about the Robert and Rachel

Many of you have heard about the Robert and Rachel Gerloff Memorial Endowment Fund. Your Council has had considerable discussions and research on this, much with the ELCA Foundation headquarters. I would like to share with you the summary of the results of this research:

~ The Gerloff Endowment agreement was created in 2009 at the ELCA Foundation but it was not funded until Mr. Gerloff's death in 2012.

- ~ The Fund is managed and controlled by the ELCA Foundation.
- ~ Yearly distributions are disbursed by the Fund to 5 ministries: Luther Seminary (using for scholarships), Faith Lutheran Church (youth and music ministries), Concordia (music scholarships), Pacific Lutheran University (music scholarships), Flathead Bible Camp.
- ~ Faith Lutheran Church is to receive \$15,000 per year from the Fund. FLC received \$60,000 from the Fund on May 6th of this year which represented payments from 2013-2016.
- ~ In February, 2017 and for the next 25 years, as long as the funds are available, FLC will receive a check for \$15,000.
 - ~ After 25 years, any funds that are available will be distributed in equal shares to the 5 ministries.
 - ~ Regarding the yearly distribution of \$15,000 to FLC:
 - These funds are designated to be used to supplement the youth and music ministries of the congregation.
 - There are no strings or stipulations other than the above. All or part of the yearly distribution can be used yearly for the youth and music ministries or a portion may be set aside for future use if the FLC Council so desires.
 - Funds received by FLC are not meant to be directed to the FLC's Endowment Fund. The Endowment Fund is managed by the ELCA Foundation and as stated, FLC is one of the 5 "income beneficiaries". It will be beneficial that the new up-dated and active FLC Endowment Committee be a part of the process as they submit their recommendations for Council approval.

We are planning FLC's 65th anniversary this fall. A date will be forthcoming soon. At this time, the memory of the Gerloffs will be honored. Please come and share your stories, and memories of Bob and Rachel. (Continued on the next page)

ELCA Church-wide Assembly Report

New Orleans is a beautiful city, and I'm glad that I went to the ELCA's church wide assembly, but I'd be lying if I said that I wasn't glad to be back home. There was a lot on the docket for us down in the Big Easy, but I think we did a pretty good job.

We adopted a new budget, most of which is dedicated to the current church-wide goal of donating 198 million dollars over the course of five years to hunger across the globe. We also voted overwhelmingly to repudiate

the Doctrine of Discovery that the church adopted in the Age of Colonialism, and to enact the AMMPARO project (Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities), which involves providing a suitable environment for South American migrants. Additionally, we voted on environmental reforms regarding investments the church makes, which will provide an alternative investment plan that doesn't involve investments in fossil fuels.

Finally, I'd like to congratulate William Horne from St. Paul Lutheran in Clearwater Florida for being elected to the office of Vice President, and will serve there for the next six years.





Faith Lutheran Awards over \$2,000 in FLBC Camperships:

This summer 13 of our youth and 2 adults attended Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp. Ten of those campers received matching camperships, and one received a full scholarship. Nearly \$2,312.50 in matching funds was awarded. By all accounts, these kids had awesome spiritual adventures on the shores of Flathead Lake. Any of them would be delighted to tell you about it; just ask one! Thanks for your generosity, Faith Lutheran Church!

Operation Christmas Child

- Boxes of Crayons (25 more), Colored pencils, markers
- Clothing like T-shirts, simple dresses, shorts, flip flops
- For older kids: sewing kits, tools, flashlights, small board games, cards
- Many more ideas are on a sheet that can be picked up at the church









