Disturbing...Good!

A few years back, they plowed up the pasture in front of my athletic club. From my squirrel cage (I mean elliptical machine), I watched the tractor pull the blades back and forth, turning soil, opening it up to rain and seed and a new crop...oats for hay, it turned out

The disturbing of soil...the disturbance of soul...is a necessary thing for growing in this world of hummus and humanity, earthy souls. We—ok, I'll speak for myself—I often view difficulties in marriage, health, parenting, and other such important matters as problems, "disturbances of my peace." But the Bible wisely teaches that hard soil—and hard hearts—must be broken, disturbed, to make room for something new.

One invitation for Lent, this season of springtime and growth and the breaking and softening of hard or frozen soils, is to welcome the things that "disturb your peace." I just got off the phone with a man who called out of the blue. He's out of one Department of Corrections drug treatment program and waiting for the next; that program, he says, allowed him for the first time ever to feel his feelings. It opened his heart first to the hurt he'd caused others and then to the hope he could still offer his 18-month-old child. I may be a sucker, but I believed him when he said this time is different and he's never going back again. It's going to be a hard, hard, journey for Dennis and his family, but I sure hope he makes it. I guess I'll bet on hope.

So what is it that's disturbing you? Maybe some of the same things that are chipping at me: Some of you know that my knee rehab has stalled, and I'm dealing with fear that my running days may be over about 10 years earlier than I was hoping. I'm grieving time on the roads with my God, my husband, and my dog—it disturbs more than I expected. So do the hurts and hangups of people I love, these female years around age 50... (TMI?; o), the chronic gimp in my dog's leg, the normal bumps of working with others and facing my own imperfections... I guess LIFE disturbs me when I stop covering my feelings with food or Netflix or a glass of pinot gris. How 'bout you?

The Bible invites us to welcome hardship as discipline (Heb. 12), our trials as purifying fires (1 Peter), and our temptations as tests that teach as well as expose what's in our hearts (wilderness in Deuteronomy and the Gospels). Lent is the season, five good weeks, dedicated to this focus.

Resources that are helpful for me: Simple daily highs and lows (joys and regrets) with someone I love in person or on the phone (Bob Maker's son Robert used to call him every morning and read the Jesus Calling entry for that day along with sports news—aw!). Brené Brown's The Gifts of Imperfections and Rising Strong, the Expriencing God study beginning March 5 in worship and small groups, The Art of Marriage course being offered through Cornerstone Bible Church, and almost any daily devotional or small group experiencing that invites daily inventory or reflection. Pastors love it when you ask us for resources!

What's disturbing you? Is anything loosening your soul, causing pain that urges change, open you to a new possibility? Do you dare to hope that God might use even THIS sort of a situation to help you,



grow you, use you? What sort of seeds might God be slipping into the soil of your life? Strong and Tender Father God, Gardener of our Souls, we are so often disturbed, angry, afraid. Open our

eyes to see your hand in our disturbances. Open our hearts to trust. Open our souls to breathe. Open our ears and minds to the seed of your word—both comfort and challenge, both consolation and command. Water us with your love, and grow your Spirit's fruits of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control in and through our lives (Galatians 5:22). Amen.





CONFLUENCE: Where spiritual exploration, deep conversation and social action meet





January Council Highlights

Planning of the Scandinavian Dinner continued and Judy Wilson was tasked with obtaining a Temporary Health Permit from Ravalli County for the dinner.

The youth group is in charge of selling T-shits, and other items, to help fund their upcoming Holden Village trip.

In February Paul Gyles will be retiring from his duties as the leader of the counting teams. Clairice Brady will taking over the counting team responsibilities. Approval was give to move \$50,000 dollars of the Gerloff Youth and Music funds into an investment fund with Thrivent Financial.

Building use contracts are currently under review and being updated as needed. The renters of Faith House have moved out, and contractors have been hired to make repairs in preparation for new tenants.



The Synod House



In addition to office space and storage space our new Synod House will be home to a chapel and a conference room. It will be modest, functional and welcoming to all. It will be the central space through which our synod staff travels to connect us and be with us.

HOW will this happen? It is happening by the grace of God, the help of Mission Builders and countless volunteers from throughout our synod. It is happening through the generosity of everyone who as individual or with their congregation or special ministry has given and continues to give toward our goal of \$1.2 million dollars.

WHO are the Mission Builders? Mission Builders are Lutherans from around the country who travel, bringing their God-given skills to help ELCA congregations, schools, camps and social ministry organizations construct buildings and now our Synod House.



WHERE will our new Synod House be located? On the lots we own, next to our former Synod Office in Great Falls.

WHEN will construction begin? In the spring of 2017 construction will begin, the Mission Builders will arrive and on June 6th the first crew of synod volunteers will begin their work, expecting to finish in early September.

WHY is my interest and involvement important? Our synod covers a lot of geography. We are united through faith and our ability to accomplish far more together than we can by ourselves. Our synod is not a club. It's a hub. Our Synod House is foundation for "reaching out" and "going out". It provides a roof over all of our heads. It's our house!
