Take time to read and reflect upon these Bible passages as part of your Holy Week observances.

Saturday	Matthew 27:57-66	lesus is buried

A Prayer for Holy Week:

CARING CONVERSATIONS

Discuss in your home or small group:

- Have you ever been blamed for something you didn't do, or taken the blame for someone else? Share your story.
- Although Jesus was innocent he was condemned to die. Why did he allow this to happen without resisting or complaining?
- How do you feel about the sufferings and death of Jesus? Why?



Read: Matthew 26:47-27:61.

Many churches set up "Stations of the Cross" to help people reflect on the events of Holy Week. These often include artwork, craft pieces, symbols, and reflection questions. People take time at each station to think, share, and pray. Create some "Stations of the Cross" in and around your home. Work together to design and set up each station. Draw pictures for or print some off the internet to represent each station. Include the following as stations:

- 1. Jesus is arrested—Mathew 26:47-56
- 2. Peter denies Jesus—Matthew 26:69-75
- 3. Jesus before Pilate—Matthew 27:11-26
- 4. Jesus is crucified—Matthew 27:32-50
- 5. Jesus is buried—Matthew 27:57-61

Once complete, invite friends and neighbors to come and observe these stations with you during Holy Week.

SERVICE

At the Last Supper Jesus served his disciples by washing their feet (John 13:1-17). He then asked them to follow his example by serving one another. As a household, wash one another's feet. Talk about how Jesus serves us and what is involved in serving each other as followers of Jesus.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

Matthew 27:45 tells us that Jesus died at the "ninth hour", or 3 o'clock in the afternoon. Observe a time of quiet (or silence if possible) in your home between 3 pm and 4 pm on Good Friday. Finish by saying a prayer of thanks to Jesus for giving his life on the cross for you.
