CARING CONVERSATIONS



Discuss in your home or small group:

- Share about a time when you were waiting for someone. What were you thinking and feeling?
- When Jesus ascended into heaven, his followers were told that he would return someday. How do you picture his return?
- Are you looking forward to the return of Jesus? Why or why not?



Read: Acts 1:8-10.

Before Jesus ascended he told his followers that they would be his witnesses, and that through them people across the world would be told to turn away from their sins and be forgiven. In your devotions times this week, discuss how you can be witnesses for Jesus. Write your ideas onto a balloon or balloons (preferably helium-filled) and let them float to the ceiling of your home. Throughout the week pray for opportunities to be witnesses for Jesus and share ways in which God has used you each day.

SERVICE &

Caring for our earth is important. Decide on an act of service you can undertake as a household this week to care for our improve your local environment (e.g., collect litter from a park or a roadside near your home).

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



In an old Ascension Day tradition from England, churchgoers carried a banner bearing the symbol of a lion at the head of a procession and a second banner bearing the symbol of a dragon at the rear. This represented Christ's victory over the devil through his resurrection and ascension. Work together to make a poster or banner featuring a lion and another featuring a dragon. Write the words "Christ has won the victory" on each and post them on the front (lion) and rear (dragon) doors of your home this week.
