#### **CARING CONVERSATIONS**



Discuss in your home or small group:

- If you could do anything you wanted, what would you like to do?
- Jesus sets us free to a new life. How is that life different from a life controlled by sin?
- What does it mean that Jesus has given life to you (Romans 6:11)? What does it mean to pick up the cross and follow Jesus (Matthew 10:38)?





Read: Matthew 10:32-33.

Jesus says that if you acknowledge Jesus before others, he will acknowledge you to his heavenly Father. However, if you reject or deny Jesus, he will deny you to his heavenly Father. What does it look like to acknowledge and tell others that you are a follower of Jesus? What does it look like to deny Jesus in front of others? In the Gospel of Matthew, only Peter denies Jesus, and he does so three times (Matthew 26:69-75). What does it say about the good news of Jesus that his final message to Peter is not judgment and rejection, but forgiveness and a call with the other disciples "to make disciples of all nations"?

## **SERVICE**



Food is an example of life-giving power. As you give thanks to God for the new life in Christ, make a donation to a food shelf, help serve at a soup kitchen, or prepare a meal for others. Offer prayers for the needs of the hungry.

## RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



According to Romans 6:1b-11, baptism joins us to the death of Christ by taking away the power of sin in our lives and giving us a new identity in Christ. Baptism also makes us alive in Christ with the promise of the resurrection. Dip your fingers into water and make the sign of the cross over your forehead or chest and say,

"[Name], you are a child of God. Your sins are forgiven and you are marked with the cross of Christ forever. Amen."

Make this a way to give thanks and praise to God for the gift and mystery of baptism that slays sin and gives eternal life to your mortal body.
