My friend Laurel Allison-Qualls lived a radiant life, and she died a radiant death. Laurel introduced me to iced coffee. Her Hershey's brownie recipe is exquisite. She sent me awesome books and dish towels at Christmas. Under the love and leadership of the God we met in Jesus, we sang, hiked, studied, prayed, even served in Nicaragua together. Laurel was a sister-friend to me, and I am so grateful to know she died smiling. Simply put, Laurel shined.

The same weekend as her memorial, I preached about Jesus' life and work in Matthew 9: "Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. When he saw the crowds, Jesus had compassion on them because they were like sheep without a shepherd."

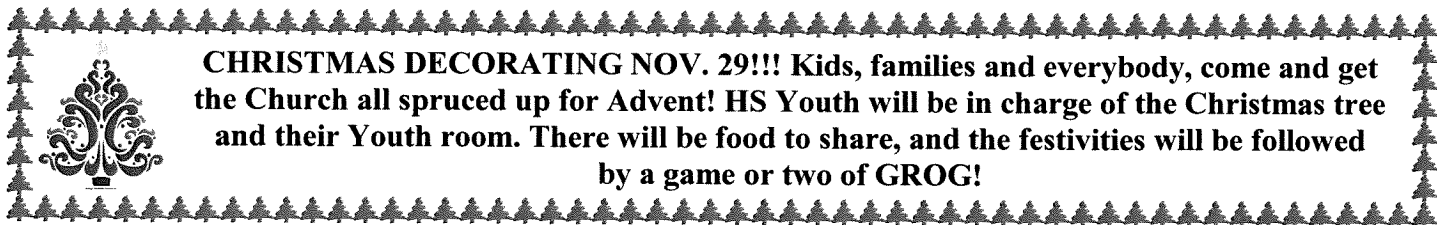
The thing is, like many, many saints before her, Laurel trusted the God who put his heart on display in Jesus. She reached out and grabbed Jesus' hand; she let the sweet shepherd love her and lead her through green pastures to work beside him, shepherding in her turn. I got to walk with them a while, and I am grateful.

Living Saints of Faith (yes, that's YOU!): Trusting the living heart of God on display in Jesus' life and death, we, too, reach out and grab his hand through our own "living, daring confidence in the grace of God" (Luther). Walking with Christ, we grow to enjoy the same belonging, significance, depth of character, truly good lives and hope-filled deaths that Laurel, Ethel, Mary, Bob, Betty, Mable and so many other saints have known.

On November 5, we remember and celebrate with thanks all who've lived before us, especially those who've shown us the light of Christ, whom we take as examples. The Apostle Paul said to his friends in Philippi: "Join together in following my example, brothers and sisters, and just as you have us as a model, keep your eyes on those who live as we do." Laurel—wise, inspired, or both—took these words from Paul as her mantra: "I can do all things through him who gives me strength," and God accomplished them in her. God, keep our eyes on such people!

The invitations of All Saints' are these: 1) **Remember** your saints, those who have loved and inspired you. 2) **Celebrate** God's light to and through them. 3) **Imitate** them, adopting life habits like worship, study, giving, prayer, and service that kept our special saints in grace through faith.

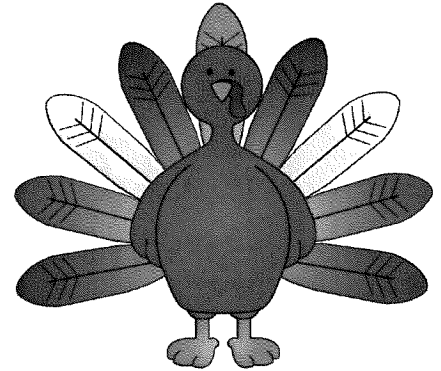
Dear Living Saints of Faith: May God bless and keep you and those you love in light and life, now and forever. Yes! Amen!

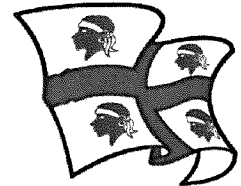


New Start Time

Boxes leave houses and packing parties, like the one at our church, and travel to the children who will receive them. Faith's Packing Party will be Sunday, Nov. 5th after church. There's something for everyone to do at the party - pack a box(es), assist others especially the young ones, enjoy a soup lunch and have a good time visiting while doing it all.

Items to fill the boxes are provided through donations and a Thrivent Action Team grant. Fortunately, because of donations and buying many things in bulk we are able to reduce the cost of filling each box but it still averages \$13-\$15 not counting the \$9 shipping cost. If you are able to help with shipping, it would be greatly appreciated. Also, if you wish to bring a special toy or other item to put in a box, please do!

Boxes travel from our church to the Collection Center (Cornerstone Church) the week of Nov. 13 - 20. Here they are packed in shipping boxes. From there they will travel to a processing center and finally off to a child somewhere in the world. If you would like to know to what country your box(es) is delivered, you can go online and donate the shipping costs and then print a trackable shipping label to put on the box(es).

Proceeds from this event will help reduce hunger and food insecurity in the Bitterroot.



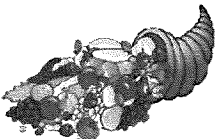

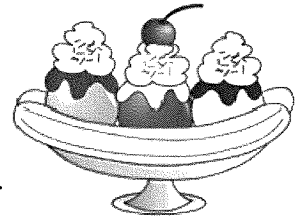

Cats vs. Griz Campus Ministry Challenge



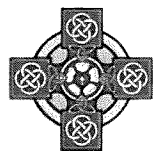
Montana Campus Ministry Challenge Special Offering

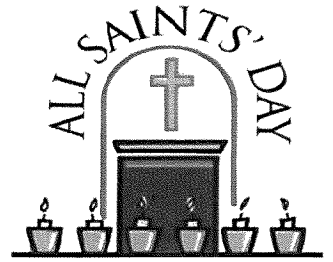

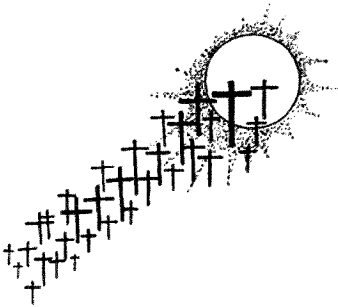

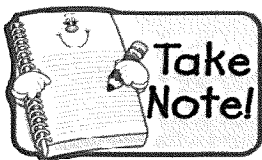

Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp Annual Meeting Report-2017

This year's FLBC Annual Meeting, October 6-7, was held at the same time as the Harvest Festival. Many families from all over Montana were in attendance. It kicked off with a dinner and live auction Friday night. Auction items were donated by individuals, businesses and churches across Montana for both the live auction and the silent auction. Proceeds went toward camper scholarships for FLBC.

The next day's festivities included breakfast, a 1 mile and 5k run, face painting, silent auction, caramel apple making, making pine cone bird feeders, guess the weight of the pumpkin competition, and many other activities for both children and families.

Board members met throughout the day and at 1:00pm, after lunch, they held the annual meeting with all the church delegates. Some highlights of the meeting include:

The election of new board members who will serve 3-year terms. Our very own Pastor Brenda was elected to another term representing the five-valley cluster. Yeah Brenda!!!

Construction of two new cabins and a new meeting room cabin are in the planning stages. One of the cabins will accommodate campers who need ADA facilities. The new meeting room will accommodate 25-30 people. Donations to-date in the amount of \$217,459.84.00 have been raised for this project.

In order to stay competitive, FLBC is striving to make the camp a yearlong destination. Numerous retreats are planned during the off summer season and this year represents the first year they will be putting on environmental education opportunities at the camp. Some schools have already lined up to take advantage of the opportunity.

The camp partnered with 23 congregations this summer providing Day Camp (VBS).

The numbers of camp attendance for the summer of 2017 are as follows:

- Youth Campers – 848 distinct campers,
- Weeklong Family Camp-29 Families-119 campers,
- Glacier Wilderness camps-19 groups-322 campers,
- Day Camp-23 Day camps-1018 est. attendees,
- Summer Retreats/Events-41 Groups-1990 guests,
- Est. F/S/W Retreats/Events-67 groups-3354 guests.

They distributed \$76,954.76 in Discounts and Camperships.

All and all it was a great informative meeting and a fun time at the Fall Harvest. Also, our very own Brady McDonald won the pumpkin weight contest with a guess of 37.5 lbs. The pumpkin weighed 36 lbs. Brady was able to take his winning pumpkin home, which now sits on his front porch waiting to be carved.

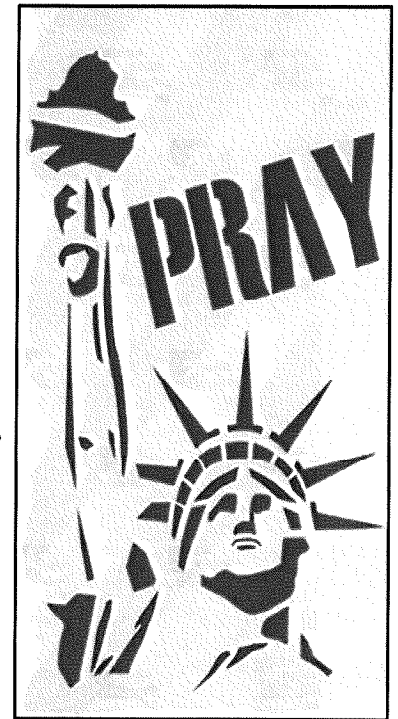

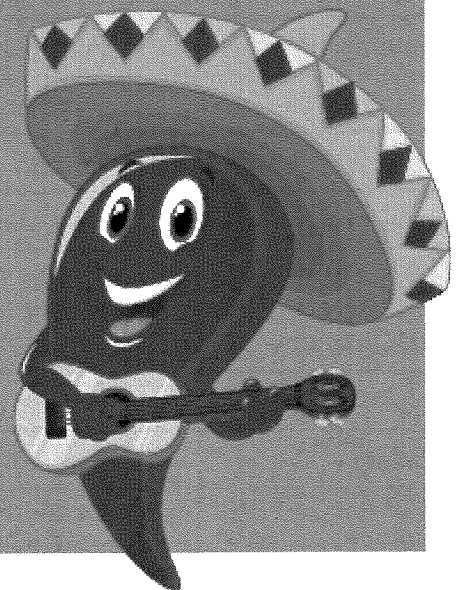

CHAPLAIN AND FATHER INSPIRE MARINE TO PURSUE MINISTRY

While deployed as a Marine in Iraq in 2005, Nathan Huffman received a visit from a chaplain that would change his life.

"He came to me and he asked me how I was doing," Huffman said. "[I gave him the] 'I'm fine' typical Marine response. But he knew I wasn't."

When the chaplain pushed for a real answer, Huffman said he hadn't received communion in over a month due to combat readiness. So the chaplain brought out his communion kit and offered him the sacrament before Huffman started his nightly patrol.

"After receiving communion, I felt at peace with dying," Huffman said. "It wasn't because I was so brave; it was because I was confident in Christ."

Nothing happened during that patrol, but that year Huffman's unit lost 46 Marines and two Navy corpsmen. Now a father of three, he counts himself blessed to be alive.

After returning from deployment, Huffman was a police officer in Richmond, Va., for several years before he and his wife began talking seriously about seminary and chaplaincy. The son of a retired ELCA pastor, Huffman was very involved in church growing up and was an active member of Epiphany Lutheran Church in Richmond.

"My father's ministry helped to illustrate the relevance of faith outside the four walls of the

sanctuary," Huffman said. "My father and my (Epiphany's) pastor both emphasized the importance of faith in times of challenge. I've carried that through my life and into ministry today."

Because others had helped him, Huffman said he felt called to help military personnel and veterans who were suffering. "My faith had been a large part of that," he said.

In 2012, Huffman began his studies at the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg (Pa.), receiving generous support from his home congregation, Epiphany. As part of his journey to ordination, he applied to and was accepted in the chaplain candidate program.

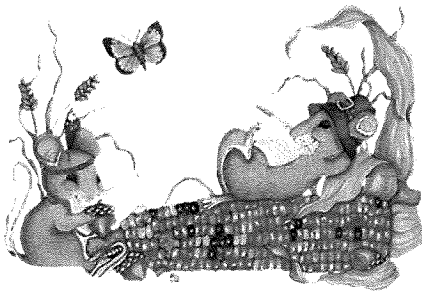
Before candidates can enter a full-time specialized ministry like chaplaincy, they must have three years of pastoral experience. Huffman is currently associate pastor of St. Michael Lutheran Church in Virginia Beach, Va., where roughly half of the parishioners are former or current members of the military.

Huffman hopes his ministry can bring light to those facing challenges today. "No one needs a light in bright places, but in dark times everyone longs for light," he said. "Christ is that flame that we carry into those dark places, and in our baptisms we are called to be the candles that carry those flames."
