delighted to see us stumble around a Bible as you are to see a toddler's tipsy steps! And every fumbling page turn gets us better acquainted with our loving, cheering God.

So let's turn over a new leaf—again, Friends of Faith! Want to know God better? Spend 2014 with *open books, open hearts, and open lives.*

Let's try again. In obedience to God's command to know and talk about Scripture (Deuteronomy 6:6-9), we'll encourage everyone to bring your own Bibles to church and open them weekly. We'll also project the lessons instead of printing them. Thrifty Lutherans: This saves money! Environmental Lutherans: This saves trees! Kids: Spark Story Bibles are in the pews—Enjoy!

Every week, folks who wish can underline key verses in our own Bibles to commit to memory. Every week, we can help our neighbors find their page. And every week, we'll grow a little more comfortable with and fond of our Bible and the God we meet in its pages.

Top picks if you need a good Bible:

- *The New Interpreter's Study Bible*, New Revised Standard Version (PB's pick, readable, serious study notes. The RSV and New RSV translations are from mainline scholars.)
- *The Lutheran Study Bible*, NRSV (great articles & aids from a Lutheran perspective)
- *The Adventure Bible*, NIV (teens, parents love it, too)
- *Life Application Bible*, New International Version (For adults, top pick of our local bookstore owner. The NIV and Today's NIV translations from the conservative evangelical tradition.)
- *NIV Study Bible* (adults, readable, more conservative commentary, study aids)

Don't let anyone tell you the Bible is easy to read. It's not. Still, you don't have to be a rocket scientist to hear God's voice in scripture. It just takes practice! And companions!

And don't let anyone tell you Lutherans don't know their Bible. At Faith, the Bethel Series, Search Bible Studies, and year after year of women's Bible studies have had our congregation firmly in the Word. Luther believed we shouldn't ever stop learning till we could argue down the Devil himself!

So let's turn over a new leaf—again and always—Friends of Faith. Let's open our Good Book, our hearts, and our lives to the Word in 2014.

The Love Day Quilters have entered the Freedom in Christ Quilt Contest again this year. Last year our quilt took second place thanks to all of you who voted online.


