Fall 2015 Learning Opportunities for Young and Old

Mark Livesay, Steward of Discipleship

Starting September 13th, we will again have “Kids Time”, a 20 minute or so period during the sermon for age appropriate lessons for the kids, who will then return to the worship service for communion. Having done an overview of Old Testament stories last year, Nancy Osborn will lead preschool and kindergarten children in studies of the New Testament this year. Grade school students will use the Sparkhouse online curriculum. This course closely follows the ELCA lectionary so our kids will have the chance to look at the Bible readings for each Sunday with instruction designed for their age group. Given that this is an online course, families who are away from church for sports or family activities can download the lesson for that Sunday and do the lesson on the road (more information on this in Sparkhouse article). I am still looking for volunteers to teach or substitute teach for the grade school children. If you would be willing to help please contact me.

Adults, we have something for you, too! Thurlowe Scudder will be leading a study on the book J.B. by Archibald MacLeish. This book is written as a play that mirrors the book of Job in the Bible. Thurlowe will be teaching his class after a short coffee time, starting about 11:00. You are encouraged to read the short book before the class starts. Several copies are floating around the church, contact Thurlowe or me if you are interested.

Parents and “Kids Time” teachers, please register your child/children for “Kids Time” and sign up for a Sparkhouse account.

There will be Sunday School registration as well as computers and assistance with signing up for the Sparkhouse online curriculum after the worship service on the two Sundays September 13th and 20th. Parents are asked to fill out the registration form for their children, and are encouraged to sign up to be able to download the Sparkhouse lessons on their computer. Sparkhouse has a very leader friendly on line curriculum with a weekly lesson plan, memory Bible verse, activities, and discussion questions. A Sparkhouse account will allow you to download any lesson, anytime on your computer, giving your family a study/activity resource on those Sundays when you are out of town. Because our kids do a lot of traveling over the weekends, we wanted to provide a tool for parents to still have some Bible time, when the family cannot make it to church. **Please meet in room 4 after worship on the 13th or 20th to register your child/children for “Kids Time” and sign up for Sparkhouse.**

The Theology of the Cross – Part Two



Still interested? I hope so!!! In Theses number 19-21 Luther comes to grips with the question of theology of the cross. In his typically abrupt style he would say: We spend most of our time learning the stories of the Old Testament and listening to the parables and teachings of Christ. But what time do we spend learning what Our Lord has to say about AFTER Easter and before His return? And in which era we live before or after Easter? So what stories and parables are we learning from the Holy Spirit concerning life after Easter? This is what the theology of the cross is all about – it's called justification or atonement. We will be using a drama form of the book of Job as a spring board into this study.

And in his typical confrontation style Luther would say: how could anyone who considers himself a follower of Christ NOT want to experience life that exists between Easter and Christ's return. Come join us this fall, no age requirement is necessary.

Items we still need to fill 100 boxes at the Faith Packing Party in November are:

- Bars of Soap (50 more), Toothpaste
- Hairbrushes and Combs (boys and girls)
- Coloring books, activity books
- Toys suitable for boys and girls from ages 2-4, 5-9, and 10-14
- Boxes of Crayons (25 more), Colored pencils, markers
- Clothing like T-shirts, simple dresses, shorts, flip flops
- For older kids: sewing kits, tools, flashlights, small board games, cards
- Many more ideas are on a sheet that can be picked up at the church
- Music makers
- Balls – soccer balls are popular
- Soft, fuzzy, plush toys and/or dolls

ELCA Malaria Campaign: Last Call!



The ELCA Malaria Campaign is 96% of the way to their goal of raising \$15 million in 5 years to eradicate malaria in 13 countries in Africa by the year 2015!
