We will try to incorporate your request into worship in the upcoming months. Thanks!






SUNDAY SCHOOL BEGINS SEPTEMBER 9TH !!






Time to Fill the Boxes!...Operation Christmas Child

It is time to think about filling Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes! As summer is ending and great box filling items go on sale it's a fine time to find things to make a child smile.

Items that are always needed to fill boxes are: Hygiene Items:



School Supplies:

• pencils, pens, pencil sharpeners, erasers, crayons, colored pencils, markers, smaller size pads of paper that fit in the boxes, activity books, coloring books

Other Box fillers:

• toys suitable for boys and girls from ages 2-4, 5-9, and 10-14 balls – soccer balls are popular, music makers, games, jewelry, soft, fuzzy, plush animals/toys and/or dolls, trucks, cars clothing like T-shirts, simple dresses, shorts, flip flops, sun glasses, hats **For older kids:** sewing kits, tools, flashlights, small board games, cards

Our goal each year is to pack at least 100 shoe boxes. You can pack boxes at home and/or the church Packing Party in November just before boxes are collected. Remember it costs \$9 to ship each box. You might think about putting a dollar a week away between now and the Packing Party for each box you think you will pack to help with the shipping costs. Also, donations of items for the Packing Party are very welcome and can be dropped off at church. If you are not a shopper financial donations are always welcome. Look for the OCC labeled tubs and in the Narthex! And thank you in advance for your generous support of Operation Christmas Child.

A message from Tricia:

Child Bridge is a faith based organization that exists to find families for children in need in our community. We also equip those families to care for the children. These are children who have been abused and neglected and are currently in the foster care system. Some need temporary help while in foster care, others need permanent family, through adoption. There are over 4,000 children in foster care in the state of Montana, and 300 of them in our local community, Missoula & Ravalli Counties. At the request of the state child and family services office, we are starting a foster and adoption support group in Hamilton. We will have a kick off gathering on September 18th from 5:30-7:30 pm at Assembly of God in Hamilton. and then we will host regular monthly meetings, beginning in October, on the second Tuesday of each month. We are in need of help with these gatherings from the local Christian community. We will need help with the monthly meals-provision, preparation, and serving—as well as help with childcare during the meetings. We are especially seeking someone to lead our children's program for the monthly meeting on that 2nd Tuesday of each month. Summary of Significant Actions August 22, 2018 Council meeting

Presentation by Ravalli County domestic violence organization SAFE, encouraging FLC involvement.

- Motion by Dean, seconded by Paul for use of Gerloff Income funds in support of the August 15th picnic passed by consensus electronic vote.
- Motion to approve ministry site profile document assembled by Call Committee with spelling and grammar corrections as noted, was approved.
- Motion to coordinate third draft of revised constitution by circulating Chapters 1-10 of second draft for review and suggested edits by council members and submit for aggregation by Paul by September 16th was approved.
- Motion to approve electronic processing for disbursement review and approval (to exclude FLC credit card transactions) passed.
- Motion to provide a \$1200.00 bonus to Mick Gray, paid at the end of September 2018 passed.
- Communications steward will be the release authority for distribution of email addressed to all FLC members that will originate from the Office- FLC email account.

An Update on Our Pastor Call Process

The first step in the call process is to complete a Ministry Site Profile. This is an eleven (11) page document that must be completed on-line. Your Call Committee has spent the first two months of the summer completing that profile. We have met a number of times, sought opinion of the congregation and obtained information from the Church Council. The profile has been completed, and was presented to the council August 22nd. The Call Committee will then upload the profile to the synod website, where it will be available for review by potential candidates.

As candidates begin to consider Faith Lutheran and express interest for interview, we will provide our next update.
