The Story of the Four Chaplains

The Four Chaplains, also referred to as the "Immortal Chaplains" or the "Dorchester Chaplains" were four United States Army Chaplains who gave their lives to save civilian and military personnel as the troop ship USAT Dorchester sank on February 3, 1943, during World War II. The vessel was torpedoed during the early morning hours of February 3rd by a German submarine off the coast of Newfoundland in the North Atlantic. The chaplains all held the rank of first lieutenant, and included a Methodist minister, a rabbi, a Roman Catholic priest, and a Reformed Church in America minster. They gave up their lifejackets when the supply ran out, then joined arms, said prayers, and



sang hymns as they went down with the ship. Some 230 of the 904 men aboard the ship were rescued.

Faith Lutheran remembers the Four Chaplains in worship on or near February 3rd by the request of several of our members and veterans. Their courage and sacrifice show us the Spirit of the God they all served.



LONG TIME ENDOWMENT HAS A PRINCIPAL INCREASE!

In 1991, Faith Lutheran's first endowment was created with a starting amount of **\$5,000.00.** No official record has been found as to the individual or group providing the funds. So, for the last 29 years with the investing of the money, interest has accumulated to \$6,131. So interestingly over this many years no money was added to the principal and no group in the church ever requested the use of any of the interest. However, early 2020 with an anonymous donation, the principal is now \$15,000! As you may already know in an endowment the principal is invested providing the interest for which money is available for grants. Obviously the larger the principal, the more likely the more interest. For anyone interested to see this

endowment to grow, any amount can be added. The State of Montana has favorable rules for tax income deduction for gits to endowments.

The church's second endowment is from the estate of Doris Koch becoming available in 2018. With the principal of \$100,000.00, it has generated nearly \$10,000 to be used for requests. The date on one has been issued for \$750.00.

For both the Faith Lutheran Endowment and the Doris Koch Endowment use of monies are not restricted to a particular use. Final decisions of approval are by the Endowment Committee member of Carol Mitchell, Lyn McKee, Amber Richardson, John Trangmoe, and Carl Russ. You may direct endowment questions to any of these folks.
