Dear Members and Friends of Faith Lutheran Church,

First, let me just say, I miss you all so very much. The words that come to mind during this time of "social distancing" are from Paul's letter to the Philippians. May you hear these words as words from me on this day. "Grace to



you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. It is right for me to think this way about all of you, because you hold me in your heart, for all of you share in God's grace with me..."

I hope I never take a handshake, a hug, or the gathering of the assembly for granted again. Thank you all so much for your prayers, for those suffering and dying from the Covid-19, for their families, for those working in our hospitals, for our teachers and students, for our community and our world, and for me.

I am receiving letters from our Bishop on a regular basis these days. In fact, the one I received last Friday is already not entirely accurate—changes to schedules etc. are changing so rapidly. As of now there will be no activities being held here at the church until further notice. I will continue to be livestreaming our Sunday worship services.

I am planning to put a Maundy Thursday Service and a Good Friday Service on our "Friends of Faith Hamilton" Facebook page. With the weather permitting, I am hoping to livestream an Easter Sunrise Service. I would then encourage you to tune into the Easter service that our Synod is working on that will be livestreamed. As soon as I have times and how to connect to that, I will let you know. I am hoping that on the first Sunday, when we return to our sanctuary for worship, we will have a full-blown Easter Sunday Celebration!

I will be sending copies of our adult study that we have been doing on Sundays out to all of you. If you are interest in being a part of this study, I would love for you to take part in this. This will begin following Easter, and I will have more details out to you soon.

There are many of you who have volunteered to help in any way you can, thank you for that. I will keep you posted as opportunities for your service present themselves.

Thank you for holding me in your heart through your thoughts, prayers, text messages, and phone calls. Please feel free to call, text or email me at any time.

Know that I hold you all in my heart as well, as I think about you, pray for you, and communicate with you through a call, text or email.

May God's peace be with you now and evermore, *Pastor Paul*


