Dear Members and Friends,

Happy Fall to all y'all. It's hard to believe that the summer is gone, and I find myself saying this every year. Do any of you find yourselves thinking or saying this as well? And we ask ourselves, "Where did the summer go?" This summer has been different for all of us because of the Covid pandemic. So many of us, including myself, want to go back to what we viewed as normal. Because of the pandemic, we are learning a new normal. At school there is now "Hybrid learning," —where some of the teaching is done online and some at home. Most students now eat their lunches at their desks and not together. And the idea of wearing a mask has become so divisive. I don't wear a mask because it's comfortable, because it is not. And I don't know how many times I have been halfway across the parking lot and discovered I forgot my mask and had to go back and retrieve it. But, I do wear a mask because I care about the people around me. I also wear a mask because it reminds me that people are getting sick and dying as a result of this pandemic. This reminder also leads me to keep praying for all those affected by Covid –to keep praying for all of our medical staff and personnel—to keep praying for those who are working toward a vaccine— to keep praying for our Spiritual leaders. and it reminds me to pray that we may become united by loving and caring for each other. It saddens me to think that this simple act of wearing a mask, or not wearing a mask can be so divisive. May we continue to wear our masks for the benefit of the others around us.

We are also close to less than a month away from election day. This also can be very divisive, but I do trust God to bring unity and reconciliation to all. May we be mindful of those around us during these times, sharing the love and joy of Jesus by what we say and what we do.






Remembering Our Saints 9:30am, Sunday, November 1

S.A.F.E. White Ribbon Week is October 18-24

The White Ribbon Campaign is a community-wide event to raise awareness about domestic violence in Ravalli County, giving people an opportunity to make a statement against domestic violence. Wearing a white ribbon symbolizes your commitment to not condone, commit or support domestic violence. It is a very simple way for our community to send a very powerful message- that our families deserve to live in homes that are safe and free from violence. Adopted in Ravalli County in 1999

with the distribution of 750 ribbons, this year 10,000 ribbons will be distributed!

Ribbons will be available at church on Sunday, October 18th. By wearing a ribbon, you are making a statement in support of ending intimate partner violence. We hope adults will speak to children about violence being an unacceptable way to solve problems, and we hope adults will speak to each other about creating and modeling respectful relationships.
