#### Dear Members and Friends of FLC

I have often said Jesus was messy. Jesus got his hands dirty. From *A Story to Tell*, our Lenten Devotional for 2021, the author uses Mark 2:6-8 for the text. Jesus has just forgiven the sins of the paralytic in verse 5 and the scribes are accusing Jesus of blasphemy! Jesus was always loving the unlovable, even if it meant opposition, which so often where Jesus found himself.

I'm pondering today the point in the devotional that speaks about Christians being "nice people". As nice Christian people the devotional reads that "We are caring, loving, and generous; and caring, loving, generous people don't go around upsetting other people with their actions." Pondering this, I feel this way most times when I am afraid.

The reading from the devotional reads, "We do not follow images of what it is to be Christian, however. We follow Christ, who had no difficulty showing compassion even when others found it offensive, loving all people despite the way that agitated others, being bold and humble all at once. Likewise we are called upon to love in ways that offend—by reaching out to someone who believes differently than we do, protesting injustice, setting a boundary, challenging an assumption, forgiving an enemy. It won't always feel good, but feeling good is not the aim. The aim is faithfulness, which can be messy."

As Jesus lives and moves within us, by the power of the Holy Spirit, may we not be stifled by fear, but instead, may we care deeply, love generously, and show compassion, as we act in ways that may upset someone.

God bless you in your Lenten journey.

# Reading through the Bible in a year: March, 2021

March 1: Jonah 3-4; 1. How does reading that God is "sheer grace and mercy, not easily angered, rich in love, and ready at the drop of a hat to turn...plans of punishment into a program of forgiveness" fit into your plans for this day? 2. How old are you? What kind of evil have you seen in your lifetime?

March 2: Philemon; 1. Imagine receiving a letter like this in the mail today. Who might be the "Paul" who sent it and who might be the "Onesimus" you are to "welcome back"? 2. Would you say you've gotten to know and trust God? How and Why?

March 3: 2 Kings1-4; 1. Describe the God you find in these stories. What impresses you about him? What surprises you? 2. What work of God have you seen lately? Who in your life should've noticed it but didn't?

March 4: 2 Kings 5-7; 1. What would you rather God require of you—" hard and heroic" or "simple"? Why? 2. What mental pictures do you see as you read this Psalm?

March 5: 2 Kings 8-11; 1. Who in your life could be described as a holy man or woman? In what ways has this person influenced you? 2. Recall in your life a "circle of quiet within the clamor of evil." When and what was going on?

March 6: 2 Kings 12-14; 1. "We each pay personally for our sins." What do you think about when you read that statement? 2. Imagine yourself as a preacher using this chapter verbatim on your message text. What are some possible responses from your listeners? Why?

**March 7: Reflection:** 

March 8: 2 Kings 15-18; 1. The "local sex-and religion shrines" seem very popular with the people of God throughout these pages. In what ways is religious culture today similar or different? 2. What individuals, groups, or institutions do you know who live by the "have a good time and get by the best you can" philosophy?

March 9: 2 Kings 19-21; 1. "Hezekiah turned ... praying ... and then the tears flowed. Hezekiah wept." What place do tears have in your prayer life? What about in your life in general? 2. Which of the Quester's "a right time to" most closely resembles your current time or season of life?

- March 10: 2 Kings 22-25; 1. You've read the history of the kings. What must you "do in response to what is written in this book"? 2. Do you have a friend with whom "you can face the worst"? Are you that kind of friend for someone else?
- March 11: Luke 1-3; 1. "But how?" "Nothing, you see, is impossible with God." What comes to mind as you read these two phrases? 2. Would you describe what you do as "hard and honest work"? do you aspire to that? Why or why not?
- March 12: Luke 4-6; 1. "Your task is to be true, not popular." Reflect on the last two weeks. How has this statement been present in your life?
- March 13: Luke 7-9; 1. Imagine yourself as a dinner guest in the home of Simon the Pharisee. What might the conversation sound like after Jesus tells the woman, "Go in peace"? 2. What have you learned from the funerals you've attended?

#### **March 14: Reflection**

- March 15: Luke 10-12; 1. "Don't bargain with God. Be direct. Ask for what you need." Take this Scripture at its word. Absorb it into your prayer life ... starting now. 2. Finish this sentence: This chapter makes me feel\_\_\_\_\_\_and \_\_\_\_\_.
- **March 16: Luke 13-15;** 1. Which of the stories do you most associate with in these passages? Why? 2. What are your "loves," "hates," and "dreams"?
- March 17: Luke 16-18; 1. Let these words begin your prayer today: "God, give mercy. Forgive me a sinner..." 2. Could a family member or friend describe you as a person with direction? How would they describe the way you walk?
- March 18: Luke 19-21; 1. "There's no telling who will hate you because of me." Who hates you and why? 2. "Follow the impulses of your heart." What immediate thoughts or feelings arise in you when you read or hear that statement?
- March 19: Luke 22-24; 1. What words would you use to describe Jesus in these last chapters? Are your word choices consistent with what you've read of Jesus so far? Why or why not? 2. What is your opinion of the Quester's last and final words: "Fear God. Do what he tells you"?
- March 20: Amos 1-3; 1. What do you see as the three great sins of America—make that four? 2. What do you like most about this chapter? What do you like least? 2. What do you like most about this chapter? What do you like least?
- March 21: Reflection
- March 22: Amos 4-6; 1. "I want justice... . I want fairness." How does this desire measure up against what you've been taught that God wants? Similar? Different? Why? 2. Whose faces do you see for the man and woman in this song? Why?
- March 23: Amos 7-9; 1. Think about the worst thing that could happen to you, your family, and friends. "That's a hint of judgment Day—that and much more." 2. Restless. Desperately. Longed. How often are these words part of your vocabulary? Why do you think that is so?
- March 24: 1 Chronicles 1-4; 1. Where and how do you see God at work in these chapters? 2. If you're a man, imagine speaking these words to a woman. If you're a woman, imagine hearing these words from a man. Describe what you're feeling.
- **March 25: 1 Chronicles 5-8;** 1. What captured your attention in this passage? Why do you think it did? 2. Where is the word heartsick applicable to your life's story?
- March 26: 1 Chronicles 9-11; 1. Who have you "linked arms" with lately, helping them become what God designed them to be? 2. "There's no one like her on earth." Put your name in place of the word "her" in that sentence. Do you believe the revised statement? Why or why not?
- March 27: 1 Chronicles 12-14; 1. What does reading that "God will be two steps ahead of you" make you feel?" 2. What is your overall reaction to these words? What about their being in the Bible?
- March 28: Reflection
- March 29: 1 Chronicles 15-17; 1. Let this be your job description for the day: "Give thanks to God, for his love never quits!" Have a good day at work. 2. "Love is invincible facing danger and death. Passion laughs at the terrors of hell." Just let these words sink in a while.

March 30: 1 Chronicles 18-20; 1. "Courage!" What words or images are roused in you by that word? 2. Keep your mind on God for at least five minutes.

March 31: 1 Chronicles 21-23; 1. David substituted "statistics for trust." Are people any different today? Why? What about you? 2. Take a walk outside today, remembering this phrase: "Bravo, God, Bravo!"

**April 1: 1 Chronicles 24-26;** 1. How do these descriptions of worship compare with your won experience of worship? 2. If God gave you the authority to "set everything right? Why?

**April 2: 1 Chronicles 27-29;** 1. If a spiritual doctor examined your heart today, would he see cluttered and unfocused or "uncluttered and focused"? If the former, what's going on? 2. God's love is described here as "indefatigable." How does that description line up with what you've experienced of love so far?

**April 3 Hosea 1-4;** 1. Under what circumstances have you seen "No Mercy" turned into "All Mercy"? How about "Nobody" change to God's Somebody"? 2. What descriptions of God are you drawn to in this Psalm? Why?


