Confession and Forgiveness

PM: As we approach this time of confession, let us remember that Jesus went to the cross to pay for our sins. There are many sins we commit collectively that seek to pull us apart from one another.

(silence for reflection)

Please join me in the confession,

All: We confess we sin by dividing ourselves into groups: the haves and the have-nots, the best and the worst, winners and losers, the popular and shunned. Forgive us for division. We sin by excluding those who are different from us: by how they look, what they wear, how they behave, how they talk, and where they are from. Forgive us for exclusiveness. We sin by isolating ourselves from the outside world. We ignore injustice. We pretend tragedies do not exist so we do not have to feel obligated to help. Forgive us for isolation. We sin by putting up walls. We keep out the things that make us uncomfortable even if it's at the expense of others. We block out the things we don't understand without seeking to hear a different perspective from our own. Forgive us for putting up walls. We sin through hate. We choose not to love our neighbors. We see the worst in others. We stereotype. We mock. We insult. We generalize. We do not give the benefit of the doubt. We hurt others. Forgive us for our hate. Amen.

PM: I am glad to remind you that Christ's love has no limits and all that we have confessed is forgiven by the grace of God through Jesus Christ's life, death and resurrection.

God Speaks To Us In the Word

First Reading

1 Kings 19:4-8

Lector: A reading from the 19th chapter of First Kings:

First Kings chapter 18 describes the contest between Elijah and the prophets of Baal. The contest proves that the Lord is God, and afterward Elijah orders the killing of the Baal prophets. Angered by the deaths of her prophets, Queen Jezebel threatens to kill Elijah. This reading finds Elijah fleeing, fatigued, and in utter despair.

⁴[Elijah] went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a solitary broom tree. He asked that he might die: "It is enough; now, O Lord, take away my life, for I am no better than my ancestors." ⁵Then he lay down under the broom tree and fell asleep. Suddenly an angel touched him and said to him, "Get up and eat." ⁶He looked, and there at his head was a cake baked on hot stones, and a jar of water. He ate and drank, and lay down again. ⁷The angel of the Lord came a second time, touched him, and said, "Get up and eat, otherwise the journey will be too much for you." ⁸He got up, and ate and drank; then he went in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights to Horeb the mount of God.

Psalm Psalm 34:1-8

Lector: Today's Psalm is Psalm 34

(Give response directions to congregation)

¹I will bless the Lord at all times; the praise of God shall ever be in my mouth.

²I will glory in the Lord; let the lowly hear and rejoice.

³Proclaim with me the greatness of the Lord; let us exalt God's name together.

⁴I sought the Lord, who answered me and delivered me from all my terrors.

- ⁵Look upon the Lord and be radiant, and let not your faces be ashamed.
- ⁶I called in my affliction, and the Lord heard me and saved me from all my troubles.
- ⁷The angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear the Lord and delivers them.
- ⁸Taste and see that the Lord is good; happy are they who take refuge in God!

Second Reading

Ephesians 4:25--5:2

Lector: A reading from the 4th chapter of Ephesians:

Christians are called to be imitators of God. This does not mean Christians are perfect. Rather, the Spirit is at work in our lives so that our actions and attitudes genuinely reflect the love and forgiveness we have received through Christ and his death.

²⁵So then, putting away falsehood, let all of us speak the truth to our neighbors, for we are members of one another. ²⁶Be angry but do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, ²⁷and do not make room for the devil. ²⁸Thieves must give up stealing; rather let them labor and work honestly with their own hands, so as to have something to share with the needy. ²⁹Let no evil talk come out of your mouths, but only what is useful for building up, as there is need, so that your words may give grace to those who hear. ³⁰And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with which you were marked with a seal for the day of redemption. ³¹Put away from you all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with all malice, ³²and be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you. ^{5–1}Therefore be imitators of God, as

beloved children, ²and live in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

After feeding more than five thousand people in the wilderness, Jesus teaches them regarding the true significance of this remarkable sign.

³⁵Jesus said to [the crowd,] "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty. ⁴¹Then the Jews began to complain about him because he said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven." ⁴²They were saying, "Is not this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How can he now say, 'I have come down from heaven'?" ⁴³Jesus answered them, "Do not complain among yourselves. 44No one can come to me unless drawn by the Father who sent me; and I will raise that person up on the last day. ⁴⁵It is written in the prophets, 'And they shall all be taught by God.' Everyone who has heard and learned from the Father comes to me. ⁴⁶Not that anyone has seen the Father except the one who is from God; he has seen the Father. ⁴⁷Very truly, I tell you, whoever believes has eternal life. ⁴⁸I am the bread of life. ⁴⁹Your ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness, and they died. 50This is the bread that comes down from heaven, so that one may eat of it and not die. 51I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."

WEEKLY MILESTONES CARING CONVERSATIONS

Take a moment to tell or think about a recent mountain high and/or valley low in your life.

Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- How does faith in Jesus impact your life today and in the future?

DEVOTIONS

Read: John 6:35, 41-51.

Twice in this text Jesus says "I am the bread of life" (vv. 35 and 48). He also says "I am the living bread" (v. 51). These words create tension with those who object to Jesus making such claims about himself. This text acknowledges that the uniqueness of Jesus causes a divide between those who accept Jesus' identity and those who do not. This passage does not try to explain why some believe while others do not, except to note that those who believe in Jesus do so by God's power. Jesus also states that believing in him as the one who is the bread of life gives not just life but

eternal life. The eternal life that Jesus gives now, not just at some future time. It is not for us understand how one comes to believe in Jesus bread of life, except to know that it is a gift from

to to as the God.


Jesus is the source of life that begins now and knows no end. It is a life entered through faith in Jesus, the one whose life feeds the world in hope. How is it helpful for you to know that eternal life with God has already begun?
