Dear Members and Friends of FLC

A happy November to you all. I cannot believe it's already here. As we "All Saints Sunday" quickly approaches, verses from Hebrews comes to mind. Hebrews 12:1-2, "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God."

What a comfort it is to know that we are surrounded by such a cloud of witnesses. We remember the witness of Jesus, who walks with us. We remember the witnesses, of the Bible, both women and men. From John Gugel's book, Cries of Faith, Songs of Hope" he writes, "Shalom is a sturdy Hebrew word. It literally means 'peace.' But shalom has a much broader meaning than just the end of hostilities It describes the wholeness

that God promises for his people. It describes the totality of God's goodness to those who are God's own."

As we remember our saints who have gone on before us, I am pleased to announce that I will be leading a grief group beginning on Wednesday, November 3 rd, at 1:00 PM. I will be using the book "Understanding your grief" your own stories to help each of us on our grief journey. I hope that you are able to attend.

I would like to close with this prayer of "Shalom" for all of us. "Give us your Shalom, Lord. Make us whole one more. Mend our brokenness. Restore our fractured spirit. Put the pieces back together again. Set our troubled souls at rest. Hush the turmoil within and soothe us with your own indescribable peace so that we might proclaim your goodness and be an agent of sholom to everyone we encounter." Amen.




Crazy About Quilting Retreat

Remembering Lynda Brady

Our daughter Lynda spent a few months with us last summer after retiring and before moving to the state of Washington. It was a wonderful time for our family. We were able to spend some time looking back and remembering her life growing up here.

She loved music and using her piano/organ skills at Faith was a highlight. She accompanied Sylvia Lewis's Junior Choir all her years of high school. She and her sister Lori always loved playing together at church, especially Christmas Eve. They would practice for weeks. Bob and Rachel Gerloff expressed their love for that music by gifting the girls with their organ when they moved to Sapphire. That organ will be moving from Helena to Reno NV soon. Lynda had a special love for bell choirs and was gathering information to begin one at Faith when her husband's work moved them out of state.

Her cousin Ken Loss talked about her eyes at her memorial service. What he didn't know then was that she was an organ donor and now someone else has those corneas. He didn't know as well that she almost lost one eye to a neighbor boy's new arrow. It barely missed the cornea. She was patched for awhile but her eye was saved.

She always looked forward to summer camping whether it was just our family or with a friends. Both Camp Tawajaneo on Salmon Lake and Flathead Bible Camp were life highlights. She worked hard selling Camp Fire candy and wreaths in Great Falls and earned her way to Tawajaneo three years in a row, spending two birthdays there. She and her friend Janet Steele recently shared some of their special memories from Flathead Bible Camp. In later years she made sure her kids were here in summer to go to Flathead as well. Those kids, Tyson and Marysa, decided they wanted memorial money to go to camperships for Flathead Bible Camp.

Life was sometimes really hard for our Lynda but I don't remember her complaining. She seemed to always find someone else with issues needing more attention. She especially enjoyed Faith's on line worship service and always had questions or comments on Sunday afternoons. She mentioned many times how she enjoyed the Sunday the bell choir played.

Thank you Faith for your love and concern for all of us in her loss. We will always remember the gifts of love bestowed on us these last months as we said good bye to Lynda and her Dad Dale. Our hearts are heavy but full. Clairice Brady

Jim Shipman liked to have fun. He and Carol traveled a lot in retirement and he was always up for a good game of pinochle. They regularly attended the game nights at Faith.
