The Operation Christmas Child Packing Party Combo

Sharing God's love and providing a way for children to learn about Jesus and his teachings are the basis for the Operation Christmas Child (OCC) shoeboxes. It's important to keep sharing this message of God's love through shoeboxes especially as we continue to deal with Covid. At this time a "traditional" Faith Church Packing Party is in the planning stages. It will include the packing line and a light lunch on Sunday, November 7th. Those who are open to being in a larger group setting with food and fellowship are invited to pack boxes at this time. We certainly encourage everyone to consider the health and safety of others and practice safe inaction protocol if you plan to attend this gathering.

For those who are not comfortable in a larger group setting, the packing line will be set up in the church Fellowship room a few days before this date and after Nov. 7th. Individuals, families, and "pods" of friends who feel safe together can come to the church during business hours and pack boxes. Church business hours are Monday through Thursday from 9 am - 1 pm. Obviously, coming to the church during the business hours will not work for everyone, so, you can arrange time outside business hours or weekends by calling or texting Linda Beyer (406-207-3471).

Look for more details in the weekly Constant Contact or at Sunday church services. And like every year, you can pick up an empty box(es) at the church and pack it/them at home and then return them to our church or at the Drop Off Center (usually the Cornerstone Bible Church on Fairgrounds Rd). Collection week is November 15 - 22.



Community Meals Faith Providing in Our Community

Community Meals provide a free meal four nights a week for anyone who would like one.

Mondays and Tuesdays meals are at the Cornerstone Bible Church on Fairgrounds Rd.

Wednesdays they are at the Assembly of God Church on Main St. and Fridays they are at the St.


St. Francis of Assisi and the Blessing of the Animals
