


P: If we say we have no sin we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. Let us confess our sin to God who is faithful and just and who has promised to forgive our sin and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Silence is maintained for reflection and self-examination

P: Most Merciful God,

- C: Have mercy on us.
- C: We confess to you that we have sinned against you in thought, word and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not trusted you with our whole heart: we have not loved one another in deed and in truth. In your compassion forgive our sin and so uphold us by your Spirit that we may live and serve you in newness of life through Jesus Christ our light and out truth. Amen
- **P:** With joy! I proclaim to you that Almighty God, rich in mercy, abundant in love, forgives you all your sins and grants you newness of life in Jesus Christ.

C: Thanks be to God!

We call our form of worship liturgical from the Greek word "leitourgia" which means work of the people

We begin with confession knowing that in confession we find a God who is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. (Numbers 14:18)


Gathering hymn is sung

The Kyrie is the Greek word for, 'O Lord'. The biblical roots of the Kyrie are found in 1 Chronicles 16:34 and informs our prayer both as a petition and a prayer of thanksgiving; an acknowledgment of what God has done, what God is doing, and what God will continue to do.




We continue with a canticle of praise



Please stand

A: We confess our faith

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven; by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the virgin Mary, and was made man. The Gospel occupies the last place, the place of honor, among the readings of the day, because it tells us of Jesus' life, ministry.

We respond to God's Word together when we confess our faith by saying one of the three creeds of the church. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen

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


The Meal



The presider continues with the preface

It is our duty and delight that we should everywhere and always offer thanks and praise to you o God, through Jesus Christ who by his death on the cross and glorious resurrection broke the bonds of sin and death and gave life to all creation, and so with the church on earth, all creation and the host of heaven we praise your name and join their unending hymn *We reply in song*

Holy Communion is also called the 'Eucharist', which is ancient Greek for 'thanksgiving' The Eucharist is at the very heart of the Church's life.



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The Presider continues with the Eucharistic Prayer It begins: You are indeed holy,

It ends: we pray for his coming again even as we sing

Presider: Send now, we pray, your holy spirit, that all of your promises may come to us and you whole creation.


Presider: This we pray through Jesus Christ, our savior and our friend.

Here the Words of Institution recalls the act which was commanded by Jesus at the last supper with his disciples, 1 Cor. 11:23-26 **Presider:** Make us bold, O merciful God, to address you as our Abba as we pray.

The Lord's Prayer is the prayer Jesus taught his disciples when they wanted to know how to pray; found in Matthew 6:9-13, it is the special prayer of God's family. Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.
