#### Lament & Laughter Kogudus retreat in Missoula


These 20 siblings in Christ took part in a "Lament & Laughter" Kogudus retreat at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Missoula April 29-30, 2022. They represented 8 different Montana communities: Baker, Great Falls, Helena, Deer Lodge, Lolo, Florence, Hamilton, and Missoula. This gathering included presentations on Lament and Laughter i.e. connecting our losses to the cross and our joys to the resurrection, small and large group sharing, a communion service, a healing service, singing, and joke telling. The participants expressed their appreciation to be able to meet in person with fellow Christians after the long isolation caused by the pandemic. Two Kogudus retreats are being planned for the fall: one in Hamilton and the other at Montana State Prison outside of Deer Lodge.
