

Endowment Committee First and Second Quarter Reports

The Doris Koch Fund was at \$100,651.59 at the end of 2021. The fund lost \$4,721.85 during the first quarter of 2022, leaving a balance of \$95,929.74 at the end of the first quarter. The fund lost an additional \$8,215.61 during the 2nd quarter of 2022 leaving a balance of \$87,714.13 at the end of the 2nd quarter.

The Faith Lutheran Fund was at \$15,400.93 at the end of 2021. The fund lost \$640.03 during the first quarter of 2022, leaving a balance of \$14,760.90 at the end of the first quarter. The fund lost an additional \$933.41 during the 2nd quarter of 2022 leaving a balance of \$13,316.27 at the end of the 2nd quarter.

Montana Jewish Project update

Dear Montana Jewish Project supporters,

It's been a very busy few weeks for the Montana Jewish Project, and I'm eager to update you all on our latest



We reached an agreement with the Catholic Bishop of Helena to push back our closing date another month—to August 31, 2022. MJP is waiting to hear if we've received a major grant for acquisition. Since we won't get word on this until the end of July, Bishop Vetter graciously agreed to move closing a month to make the logistics easier on us all. This will be the last closing extension.

The great news is that we are very close to returning this historic synagogue to Jewish use for the first time in 86 years!

However, we aren't quite at our goal. We need to raise a final \$200,000, and we are seeking your help in this last stretch. This is not as daunting as it might sound. We feel very positive about the grant and our ongoing meetings with a donor at the \$50,000 level. This leaves us with \$50,000 more to raise in the next four weeks. This is where you can help!

Remember that MJP will return in full any donation marked "for acquisition only" if we fail to buy back Temple Emanu-El. We hope we will not have to do this!

After you make your donation, we ask that you please forward this message to those in your life who support thriving Jewish community and traditions. You could also include the <u>fantastic</u> <u>feature article</u> Moment Magazine (*Editors note: Bishop Jungling is quoted in this article and her full letter is <u>available here</u>) just published about Temple Emanu-El, the 1890s community who established it, and MJP's work to reacquire it.*

As always, please call or email me with any questions. We remain committed to reclaiming our synagogue. We are excited to enrich Jewish life around our state. Thank you for helping us make this happen.

Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Ministry

<u>What is it?</u> - An outreach program through the Franklin Graham Samaritan's Purse ministries for the children of the world, some living in very remote areas that other ministries have not reached yet.

<u>How does it work?</u> – A shoebox is filled with hygiene items, school supplies, toys, clothing, crafts, balls, flip flops, plush toy, anything a child might like but NO liquids, food/snacks, items representing military or danger. Then the box is shipped and given to children along with the story of Jesus in their own language and a chance to attend bible classes.

<u>How can you help?</u> – Pack a box at home or at the Faith Lutheran Packing Party (in November) and have it ready for the collection week in November. And/Or, help with the shipping costs of \$10 per box. Pack a box online for \$25 at Samaritanspurse.org/occ.
