



Dear Friends and Members of FLC

Thank you all for the cards, gifts and words of appreciation Gwen and I received from you throughout the month of October. We appreciate all of you as well. Philippians 1:3-4, "I thank my God, every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now." Thank you again.

The first Sunday in Advent begins on November 27th, which is also the beginning of a new Church Calendar Year.

"The early Christians developed the "church's year" as a way of telling, learning, and reliving the story of Jesus, which stands at the heart of our faith. As they did so, they came to understand that it wasn't simply a matter of going round and round the same sequence and never getting anywhere.

Think of a bicycle wheel; it goes round and round, but it is moving forwards, not standing still. . . . So it is with the church's year. We go round the circuit: Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Holy Week and Good Friday, Easter, Pentecost. The traditional Western churches sum all this up on Trinity Sunday, as we learn more deeply who our glorious God really is.

"... [But] we are not simply going round and round the same topics and never getting anywhere. We are signing on as part of God's larger project, God's forward purposes, his plans for the whole creation to be renewed, so that (as the prophets said) the earth will be full of the knowledge and glory of the Lord, as the waters cover the sea. . . . Ruth was faithful in worship until a stroke centered in her eyes and dimmed her eyesight. That caused her eventual move from Sapphire to nursing care. She developed a keen sense of recognizing voices and even the last time we took her communion before visitation stopped, she could not see us but knew our voices

Ruth's apartment at Sapphire Homes was a hub of life there. She knew everyone and was the one who encouraged and made events happen. Ruth loved her birthday and though her family was scattered, they made sure it was recognized every year in a big way. There were big parties at Sapphire around a birthday cake every summer. Often those were held outside.

Hardly anyone visited Sapphire without seeing Ruth. I think she heard the footsteps in the hall and her door flew open. She was the heart of hospitality. When Vera DeTienne and I did some wallpapering there years ago, Ruth was always near with cookies and reassuring comments. There were always papering hiccups and Ruth's encouragement often saved the day.

She loved her family with all her heart - daughters and a son and all those they married. One daughter talked about that at Ruth's Service – the word "in-law" didn't seem to be in her vocabulary.

Ruth knew where she was going and she's there now and we are all better for having known her.
