

From Pastor Paul

Dear Friends and Members of FLC

Christmas will be here soon, and Rick posted this on our Facebook page. I enjoyed the article from Brian Stoffregen, and I trust you will as well. Merry Christmas to you all.

"There are often complaints about the word "Xmas". "They have taken Christ out of Christmas," decry some.

Christ may have been replaced by commercialism in the celebration of this Festival season, but that isn't where the "X" comes from.

The word "Christ" in Greek looks like this: $XPI\Sigma TO\Sigma$ (pronounced "christos"). The first letter is an "X," but it is not an "ex" as in our alphabet, but a "chi" (rhymes with "sky") in the Greek alphabet. This letter has a "ch" sound – like in the word "Christ".

While the second letter looks like a P (pee), in Greek it is a Rho and sounds like the English "R".

The "chi rho" is common Christian symbol that uses the first two letters from $XPI\Sigma TO\Sigma$. Because of the shape of the letters, the symbol is often mistaken for a "PX". A chi-rho symbol is one of the oldest Christian symbols. Some examples of the Chi-Rho symbols are attached. There's probably one in your congregation.

Spelling the holiday "Xmas" doesn't necessarily take Christ out of the holiday; neither does spelling the word "Christmas" put Christ into the holiday."

In all the interruptions, worries, joys and sorrows we often miss the time to simply slow down and observe and feel the peace and love and hope of this Christmas Gift from God. The Joy of Christmas and the hope of a New Year we can have a renewed sense of the goodness of God and the blessings of a caring and compassionate congregation of friends and family where we fellowship and outreach to each other and to our community.

After this Christmas Season life will return to its usual pace so let us permit ourselves to be reborn with this gift of the Messiah, let us like Mr. Scrooge find the real meaning of Christmas, the spirit of joy and sharing with each other. God brought great comfort to His people and taught us how to comfort each other. God's gift to us was Jesus, so let's ponder the importance of this gift everyday this coming year. The main sponsor of each family purchases a \$100 grocery certificate, in addition to the wants and needs of the family, BUT we all know \$100 doesn't buy many groceries.


