Silence for self-examination

Candle Lighting of the Advent Wreath

Prayer

All: All-loving God, break into our world and our hearts again. Magnify your love in us until it overflows to our neighbors. Renew our faith to relive the wonder of your love. Prepare our hearts to be transformed by you that we may shine the light of your compassionate love. Come, God of Love, come. Amen

Hymn: "Light One Candle to Watch for Messiah" ELW #240 vv 1-4

1 Light one candle to watch for Messiah: let the light banish darkness.

He shall bring salvation to Israel, God fulfills the promise.

2 Light two candles to watch for Messiah: let the light banish darkness.He shall feed the flock like a shepherd, gently lead them homeward.

3 Light three candles to watch for Messiah: let the light banish darkness. Lift your heads and lift high the gateway for the King of glory.

4 Light four candles to watch for Messiah:

let the light banish darkness.

He is coming, tell the glad tidings.

Let your lights be shining!

Gospel Reading: Matthew 1:18-25 MSG

The birth of Jesus took place like this. His mother, Mary, was engaged to be married to Joseph. Before they came to the marriage bed, Joseph discovered she was pregnant. (It was by the holy Spirit, but he didn't know that.) Joseph, chagrined but noble, determined to take care of things quietly so Mary would not be disgraced. While he was trying to figure a way out, he had a dream. God's angel spoke in the dream: "Joseph, son of David, don't hesitate to get married. Mary's pregnancy is Spirit-conceived. God's Holy Spirit has made her pregnant. She will bring a son to birth, and when she does, you, Joseph, will name him Jesus--'God saves'--because he will save his people from their sins." This would bring the prophet's embryonic sermon to full term: Watch for this--a virgin will get pregnant and bear a son; They will name him Emmanuel (Hebrew for "God is with us"). Then Joseph woke up. He did exactly what God's angel commanded in the dream: He married Mary. But he did not consummate the marriage until she had the baby. He named the baby Jesus.

CHRISTMAS PAGEANT BEGINS:

Welcome:

Welcome everyone to Bethlehem! Let us open our eyes and ears and listen to the story of when Christ was born. We need a Mary and Joseph for our pageant—who would like to be Mary? Joseph?

Part I: Mary and Joseph

Hymn: O Little Town of Bethlehem. ELW #279
(Mary & Joseph with baby take there places up front during song)

- O little town of Bethlehem,
 how still we see thee lie!
 Above thy deep and dreamless sleep
 the silent stars go by;
 yet in thy dark streets shineth
 the everlasting light.
 The hopes and fears of all the years
 are met in thee tonight.
- 2 For Christ is born of Mary, and, gathered all above while mortals sleep, the angels keep their watch of wond'ring love.
 O morning stars, together proclaim the holy birth, and praises sing to God the king, and peace to all the earth!
- How silently, how silently the wondrous gift is giv'n!
 So God imparts to human hearts the blessings of his heav'n.
 No ear may hear his coming; but, in this world of sin, where meek souls will receive him, still

the dear Christ enters in.

4 O holy Child of Bethlehem, descend to us, we pray;
Cast out our sin, and enter in, be born in us today.
We hear the Christmas angels the great glad tidings tell; oh, come to us, abide with us, our Lord Immanuel!

Narration:

Mary and Joseph, a pitiful sight. So tired and dirty, they gave me a fright. Sickly or dying? What was the matter? "A room in the inn?" Impossible chatter! "My rooms are all taken; not one empty bed. There'll not be a room in all Bethlehem," I said. But their eyes told a story of hunger and need. I couldn't avoid them, so I tried a good deed. I cleaned up the stable: Rachel cooked up a meal. We helped all we could, at least, that's how I feel. For we noticed that Mary was expecting – and soon! So we prepared for delivery right under the moon. The child came so quickly. His face seemed a light. As if God had shone God's presence so bright. Joseph said softly. "It's Jesus, my friend." God sent him among us to bring to an end fear and hatred, darkness, and sin. Instead God gave light, to let God's love in.

Part II: The Animals (All of the animals come forward)

Song: The Friendly Beasts: Mia Mendenall

Narration:

My animals were calm, quieter than normal.

They often were noisy, and never too formal.

They always were eating, or else they were sleeping.

The stable required continuous sweeping.

But on Christmas night, they were strangely in awe at the sight of the babe and all that they saw.

It's as if they were aware that God had just hushed them,

Had fed and watered and carefully brushed them.

They knew, I believe, that God had been able to work a miracle there in that stable.

Song: "Away in a Manger" ELW #277 vv 1 & 2 (Angel with star goes and stands behind Mary and Joseph during this song)

- Away in a manger, no crib for his bed, the little Lord Jesus laid down his sweet head; the stars in the bright sky looked down where he lay, the little Lord Jesus asleep on the hay.
- The cattle are lowing; the baby awakes, but little Lord Jesus, no crying he makes. I love you, Lord Jesus; look down from the sky and stay by my cradle till morning is nigh.

Part III: The Angels

Song: "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing" ELW #270 vv.13 (All the other angels move to the front)

Narration:

"To see Jesus the Christ, whom God has perfected."

"Go worship the Lord and follow his ways.

And you'll find Christmas joy for all of your days.

Song: "O Come, All Ye Faithful" ELW #283, vv1&2 (All shepherds move to the front during the singing of this Carol.)

2 The highest, most holy, light of light eternal, born of a virgin, a mortal he comes; Son of the Father now in flesh appearing! Refrain

Narration:

The shepherds, I told you, where scared and stunned. "Too much hard work or too much hot sun!"
That's what they thought; that's how they explained.
Perplexed and afraid, they loudly complained.
But the angels' song calmed them, and then they believed.
They rejoiced when they knew and they were quite relieved.
They went to the stable and worshiped the Lord.
Then they left and began to spread the good Word.

Part V: Wise Persons and Star

Song: "We three Kings"
(Pres. Hymnal #66 vv 1 & 5)
(Wise persons make their way forward)
