

Pastor's Ponderíngs -

Something for us to ponder as we begin Lent. I would like to share from Dietrich Bonhoeffer, "Letter from Tegel Prison," 1944.

"Before God and beside God we live without God. God lets Godself be driven out of the world onto the cross. God is impotent and weak in the world, and exactly in this way alone God is with us and helps us. Matt. 8:17 makes it very clear that Christ does not help by the power of his omnipotence but by the power of his weakness and his suffering! Here is found the decisive difference from all religions. The religiosity of human beings directs them in their need to the power of God in the world.... The Bible directs human beings to the impotence and suffering of God; only the suffering God can help. Insofar as one can agree to the development of the world's coming of age, which does away with a false concept of God., the way is made free for the God of the Bible, who attains power and space through his impotence in the world. It is surely here that the 'worldly interpretation' will have to begin."

May God companion with us as we journey to the cross during lent and await Christ's resurrection at Easter.

"In a perfect world, we'd all be on the same page, we'd all agree on everything. It is easy to have opinions but sometimes it is not easy to understand others' opinions and to honor their ability to function in ways that we would have done differently. (1 Peter 5:5) Be kind and humble in spirit.

In Ephesians 4, Paul shares a crucial implication of the gospel - unity in the Body of Christ: "I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace" (Eph. 4:1-2). Paul has listed the heart attitudes we must adopt as we set about to walk in a worthy manner. With humility, gentleness, and patience, we are to—and this is the imperative—bear with one another. To bear is to put up with, endure with one another. But as Christians, we know that we can't just live with these disagreements outwardly while seething inside; instead, we must bear with a right heart motive and attitude. That's why Paul says we are to bear in love. A good summary of bearing would be to tolerate lovingly. We put up with one another's weaknesses, failures, differences, preferences, even sin with an attitude that proactively wants to love others, point them to Christ, and build them up."
