

Pastor's Ponderíngs -

Dear friends and members of FLC -

I recently read an article of an interview with translator Carmen Acevedo Butcher on the gentle wisdom of mystic Brother Lawrence. Brother Lawrence was a lay brother of the Order of Discalced Carmenlites on the Rue Vaugirard in Paris in the 17th century. He took the religious name, Lawrence of the Resurrection.

Brother Lawrence is one of my favorite people. He worked as kitchen help in the monastery. He learned that whatever he did he would do it for the Lord—it mattered not what that was. In fact, one of his quotes is "we ought not to be weary of doing little things for the love of God, who regards not the greatness of the work, but the love with which it is performed."

This statement is also very biblical. In Paul's letter to the Colossians he writes, "Whatever your task, put yourselves into it, as done for the Lord and not for your master." Brother Lawrence was well known for doing this, and thus was able to say, and I quote, "It is not necessary to have great things to do. I turn my little omelet in the pan for the love of God."

It doesn't matter how small or insignificant we may feel about what it is we are doing. What is important is to know that whatever it is we are doing; we are doing it for the Lord, with love.

I invite you to join with me this month to ponder and be guided by this quote from Brother Lawrence, "Think often on God, by day, by night, in your business and even in your diversions. He is always near you and with you; leave him not alone."

Councíl Corner March 2023 1 Cor12:12-13: ¹²For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. ¹³For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body— Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

In 1 Corinthians, sandwiched between versus on "The gifts of the Spirit" and "The gift of Love" is 1Cor12:12-13, the members of the body metaphor. Doesn't this make you wonder why the heading isn't "The gift of the body"? If we pan out just a bit more, we see that this discussion of gifts is sandwiched between the institution of Eucharist and a section on orderly worship and funny enough, and important to Greek rhetoric, the center of this section is the body metaphor.

Without "the Body" aka the church, specifically the local congregation, there is no place for the gifts to go to work. The gifts of the Spirit have no one to inspire. The gift of love has nowhere to go, no one to receive communion, no one to worship God.

What is wonderful about 1Cor12:12-13 is that it reminds us that under God, within the community created by God the foot is as important as the head. There is no hierarchy, only roles to perform where we can ply the talents granted to us by God for the benefit of the body and our neighbors.

For the moment let us treat the council as the head. What use is a head if it doesn't see? We need the foot to show us where to step and not to step. What use is the head if it doesn't listen? What use is an ear if no one speaks?

It is easy and convenient to vote in the council and let them "take care of it". We need to see what you see, we need to hear your voice or we don't know what "to take care of". And we are profoundly grateful for all the parts of the body that are at work serving FLC and the community where it is planted.


Also, please remember hunger doesn't go away in the summer. Please consider supporting our local food banks if you are able as food insecurity continues to grow in our area.
