REMEMBERING JACK WIGEN

Jack Wigen was in church Christmas Eve to celebrate Christ's birth. Just a few days later he was in the arms of that same Savior. No one who knew Jack ever doubted his love for his Lord.

Jack has been an integral part of Faith Lutheran for many years. After taking some time to worship at Corvallis Methodist and serve Christ there, he and Ginny returned to Faith and both said, "We're back and we're home." And we are all blessed by that decision.

Quick wit and a wealth of knowledge have long been recognizable traits of Jack Wigen. Among many evidences of this trait, one I specifically remember, happened on August 6, 2000. The Bitterroot was surrounded by fire. Members of the Ultreya group had gathered to worship and share faith at Faith. As we stepped out the back door, we noted a fire east of the church had "blown up." We all stared through our dense smoke at the massive cloud and Jack spoke. He explained to us the science of fire and how it can create its own weather that could spark new fires and sometimes even rain. He referred to it as a fire tornado and how extreme conditions cause it. That night we learned some fires had spread and new ones had been sparked.

Jack served the Church Council as Steward of Property and Grounds, and it was during his term that he okayed the removal of some beautiful but outgrown shrubbery and said yes to the group who developed the Rose Garden.

Jack's gentle nature and his love for Christ and His Church will be forever remembered by many folks at Faith and the community as well. Ginny...we grieve with you. We too have been blessed by his presence and our arms are around you.
